Biographical Sketch

Sergeant Trevor Oppenborn is a 11B Airborne Ranger serving his first season on the Knights as a demonstration parachutist for the Black Demonstration Team.

In 2004 Oppenborn graduated from Klein High School in Spring, Texas. One month after graduation he enlisted into the U.S. Army to become an Airborne Ranger. After Basic Training he proceeded directly into Airborne, Air Assault, and Ranger Schools; eventually he picked up Halo School and earned his Expert Infantryman and Combat Infantryman's Badges.

In the Fall of 2008, Oppenborn was afforded the opportunity to attend the Golden Knight Assessment and Selection Program. Upon completion of the rigorous eight-week program he was 'knighted' and assigned to the Black Demonstration Team.

In Four fast years Oppenborn has been assigned to two Long Range Surveillance Detachments and worked in Ireland, Germany, Afghanistan, Kuwait. Since he started jumping in 2006, Oppenborn has logged more than 500 free fall Parachute Jumps.

In his free time, Oppenborn enjoys skydiving and on the bad weather days flying in the Vertical Wind tunnel.
