

January 2010 Meeting Minutes Buechel Station January 14th, 2010

The meeting began at 7:31 PM with Assistant Superintendent Mike Wingfeld conducting the meeting in Kevin Rose's absence. There were 17 members, one guest, and one new member. Mike did not have a formal agenda, so we just talked along general lines.

Dawn Jewell was not available to present the financial report. The December 09 minutes were approved as presented.

Under old business, Rick Maloney found a Digitrax Chief system, but it could not be used because the system could not take an address. As related to the power box, there is a battery that is bad in the box. Rick plans to fix that as well as possibly fix the analog throttles that overload so easily. He also took an inventory of the analog throttles. We have at least five of them. They are hooked into the back of the box and are tethered so operators can at least be able to move around near the box.

Speaking of throttles, the Board was to look at acquiring a few of the Digitrax UT4-R throttles. Hardly anyone knows how to operate the DT-100s and the DT-400 that belongs to the club is really needed to be available for operators to program their locomotives. Joe Martin made a motion authorizing the Board to explore and possibly purchase some throttles, which was approved by the members.

And speaking of the digital system, there was a follow up discussion from previous meetings regarding getting the UR 92 Duplex receiver. Tests have proven that the radio signal on the simplex system is not compatible with the duplex system, and vice-versa. Tests also have proven that the system can handle both the simplex and duplex receivers. Further discussion on this issue is ongoing.

The Great Train Expo show was discussed. John Voller gave more or less a quick After Action Review. We had a 30 foot by 60 foot layout with modules from Nashville N-Trak and CINTRAK of Indianapolis.

Setup took about four hours on Friday. Nashville guys hung out at John's layout Friday night. Saturday had the final touches made to the layout before opening. We were up and running when the show opened.

Overall, operationally the layout was fine. There were some issues with the radio signals. It came to find out another club had their DCC system up and running and, somehow, there were interference. The system was babied through the weekend.

Saturday night dinner at Buckhead's was done as well. A good time was had by all.

Sunday had no significant operational problems other than what was mentioned. The crowd looked to be okay. The Sunday newspaper had a picture of the layout, so we had some press coverage. Teardown went quickly and most people were on the way out within an hour to an hour fifteen minutes.

While Rick was getting the throttle box together at the end of the show (plus to

rebuild it at home), he noticed we did not have that many UP-5 s for the layout. A motion was made to acquire six of these units with Mike Wingfeld reimbursing the club for two of them. It was discovered at the show that his UR-91 for his module/layout was causing a voltage drop that will be solved with the UP-5s. Motion was made by Bruce, seconded by Rick, passed by the members.

New modules were discussed. In past meetings, the board was looking at making a new yard and four corners, and leaving the rest of the modules to individuals. As of now, this issue will be tabled because of what will be the end of our tenure at Buckner. The State plans to start construction as early as the summer of 2010, so time is running out. Because of this, club, and private owned modules will be hard to be kept. We'll be looking for another storage location.

And speaking of new modules, the discussion on a set of show modules came up. Once again, because of the situation above, this item will be tabled until later.

Under new business, it's election time again! Kenny Halgash's and Kevin Rose's position on the board is up for election. Nominations were accepted at this meeting and will be accepted at February's meeting with voting commencing in March. Ballots will be available in the newsletter and at the March meeting. Keep in mind you have to have your dues paid by March in order to run for office and/or vote. Nominations have to be accepted by the nominee in order for them to be valid. John Voller nominated Kenny and Kevin, but Kenny declined the nomination. Rick Maloney nominated John Wesson, but John was not in attendance. So, the two nominations we have, pending acceptance, are Kevin Rose and John Wesson.

A reminder that dues are due by March was made. Contact Dawn Jewell for arrangements.

John Voller made a motion to move the meeting in July at his house to the second Saturday of the month, which is July 10th. This will be a meeting/get together/open house even that will include running trains, clinics, and all that good stuff. The motion was approved. Details on content and meeting agenda will be provided before the event. John is planning on Phase 2 of his layout and will be tearing part of it apart. So, if you have not seen his layout yet, make a point to see it. We have an informal get together at his house on Thursday nights minus meeting night.

Kenny Halgash will be providing a show listing for the shows available this year. This will be a detailed listing of the shows, contact information, and other information that may help the members attend if they want to, or even if the club wants to take some modules or group together for a trip. A basic list is constantly updated in each newsletter issue and on the website.

Future meetings were discussed. Joe Martin was acknowledged for hosting January's meeting. February's will be at Buechel Station with Don Smith hosting. March has not been decided pending a time for the New Albany Library show. Down the road, Bob and Ramona Johnson want to host the June meeting at their house.

On the roundtable discussion, Bruce mentioned that the helix for the walkway to the old Big Four bridge has been constructed on the Louisville side. Don Smith wanted to pass an idea for the members to help the convention in Houston this year. Jim Prentice mentioned that Factory Direct Trains has a bit sale on the Broadway Limited E units with sound and DCC. Finally, Don thought of another thing at the end. He has a friend who is selling his 4 foot by 4 foot layout, complete with engine and rolling stock. He plans to have pictures at the next meeting.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed.




