## **Editor's Notepad**

I hope everyone had a great holiday season. I do not have anything to say this month, so let's get started with the AAR (After Action Review) of the Open house in Bucker last month.

After Action Review
K&I/KSONS Open House
Buckner Fire Station, Buckner, KY
December 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, 2009

**Background:** The Kentucky & Indiana HO model railroad club wanted to have an open house at the Buckner Fire House. The asked the KSONS if they would mind setting up the N-Trak layout and participate in this event. A motion was made back in the July 2009 KSONS business meeting to participate in the event and was passed by the membership. At that time, no one volunteered to be the coordinator.

**Setup:** Setting the layout was done over a month period after the New Albany Library. I do not remember who actually started setting up the layout. Whoever did this, thank you for doing so. I do remember stopping on my way to Cincinnati for a show at the end of October and saw that most of the layout had the legs together.

The second part of the layout setup was the day after the Division 8 show on November 22<sup>nd</sup>. Paul Downs, Kevin Rose, Kenny Halgash, Rick Maloney, and Joe

Martin attended. The layout had to have some of the modules moved around, but the modules were put together and the tracks were connected.

The third and fourth part of the setup occurred during the week before the show. Mike Wingfeld and Bruce Goreham hooked the power and the loconet and tested the layout. Final clean up was done Saturday the 5<sup>th</sup> just before the fire station was opened to the public. Joe Martin, Jakob Jewell, and Mike Wingfeld moved one module inside the pit while Mike helped with sweeping the floor.

**Saturday the 5<sup>th</sup>:** There was a slight problem in getting the system on line. But, when that was done, we were able to operate. Because of the cold air outside, some of the railroad equipment did not work too well until it was warmed up. The members who stopped by included Mike Wingfeld, Jakob Jewell, Joe Martin, Nick Amy, Josh Caudill, Phillip Johnson, new kid Nick Coates, and Rick Maloney. There were some intermittent operating problems at the end of the day, but it could have been the railroad equipment. Public attendance was decent. There were two people that seemed interested in what we had to offer.

**Sunday the 6<sup>th</sup>:** The layout operated fine once the railroad equipment got warmed up. Mike Wingfeld, Jakob Jewell, Joe Martin, new kid Nick Coates, Rick Maloney, Paul Downs, and Bruce Goreham showed up and either operated, talked, or did work on the layout. Paul brought out the new signs for the KSONS club and displayed them on the wall. There was not as many people on Sunday as there were on Saturday, but overall attendance seemed to be okay.

**Tear Down:** Tear down did not exist, for we have until the week of January 8<sup>th</sup> to get the layout apart in time for the Great Train Expo. Therefore, any one that had time to stop by to operate the layout had the chance.

**Notes:** Anyone who wants to be a coordinator for these shows needs to know how to hook up the box and the loconet cables should something happen to those that know how to do this or are unable to attend. There used to be a laminated sheet of paper with pictures and instructions on how to hook up the power box and how to start up the system. Paul Downs provided the document to Dawn Jewell for upload to the site, which is up there now. Some tweaks need to be done to the document, like where to place the main loconet cables and the actual placement of the power cable to the yard, but these will be worked out.

**Conclusion:** If you could not attend this show, then you missed out on a perfect opportunity to tweak your equipment in time for the Great Train Expo. With Christmas parties and shopping and stuff going on at the same time, it is hard to get operators to participate. That's understandable.

Between the end of the Great Train Expo and the next show, which is possibly New Albany, it would be great to hook up the modules again just to make sure they're operational. Thanks to everyone who helped set up and especially those who attended. We may get one or two more members from this show, we hope. Joe


