
Down the Pike: KSONS Scheduled to Appear: Currently no shows scheduled.

Directions to the First Presbyterian Church:

To get to the church from Louisville taking I-65 North over the Kennedy bridge, take the first exit at the North end of the bridge. At the end of the ramp turn right onto Court Avenue. Go East on Court Avenue six blocks to Walnut Street. Post Office is on the left and bakery is on the right corner. Turn right on Walnut Street and go two blocks to Chestnut Street. First Presbyterian Church is on the corner. Turn left on Chestnut, go one half block, turn right into parking lot. Enter to the basement is available inside church. If you are coming across the Second Street Bridge, turn right at the stoplight. This will put you on Court Ave. continue East on Court Avenue under the Interstate.

April Meeting Minutes

The April KSONS meeting was held at the Floyd County New Albany Public Library as we were in the middle of our semi-annual show there. Kevin Rose presided.

We had one guest, I believe he said his name is John Lay, but I'm not sure I heard him correctly.

The March minutes were approved as published.

John Voller gave his final report as the outgoing treasurer. The reported was accepted. Thank you John for a job well done, and welcome Dawn Jewell as the new treasurer. The only loose end in the transition is the lack of a bill from the K&I club for gas at the Buckner firehouse.

Besides treasurer as mentioned above, there are some other changes in the board organization. Kenny Halgash now has the title of Show Liaison. New board member Mike Wingfield takes over from Rick Maloney as Assistant Superintendent.

The Board of Directors had their first meeting after the election last month. Among their decisions at that time was approval of a logo for use on club shirts. The membership was shown an example and also approved its use. We will continue with the use of Maroon shirts and are currently searching for a good price on a polo shirt. T-shirts can be done now for \$12 to \$15 dollars depending on size. Adding a name will be an additional \$6 to \$8. Contact Bobbi Hedge if you're interested.

A skyboard-sized banner has been designed for use on show modules. This is intended to get information about the club to the casual viewers at shows, and thereby to increase membership. There will be two made, one for use with T-trak modules and one for the Ntrak display module.

Kevin Rose finally got an equipment wish list from the group of T-trak modelers in KSONS. They could use a Digitrax radio Super Chief and tables. After some discussion of the expected price for these items, a motion was made and passed by the membership to limit expenditure to \$762. This will be KSONS club property and use will not be limited to T-trak.

Kevin expressed great disappointment in the members over lack of participation at the library show. Not enough members were available to set up the layout in a timely fashion. We have been late in opening the layout during the week, and there has been a lack of runners. We have had some difficulties in our relationship with the library management and fear that they make take issue with this. This led to a long discussion of the general malaise in the club since the convention and how we need to whip ourselves into action for shows. A motion was made and passed to allow Kevin and Steve Shetter to apologize to the library and perhaps negotiate our fee downward. Kevin also urged us to take ownership of some aspect of the club activities since it makes the hobby more enjoyable.

We will soon be taking inventory of the club property. We will also begin work sessions to do needed maintenance on club modules. Maintenance on privately owned modules at Buckner is the sole responsibility of the owner.

Our next shows will be a T-trak layout at Oldham County Town & Country Days. This will be May 9th from 9 to 3 o'clock. There will be an open house by K&I at Buckner that day and KSONS should also have the N-Trak layout operating during that event.

The May meeting will be hosted by the Hedges' house. In June we will be at the Johnson's and at John Voller's in July. We have no host for August, but Jerry Harris will have us over to his place in September.

Ernie Julian's mother passed away recently and the club will send a sympathy card. Bobbi Hedge thinks we should create a committee to take care of cards as such situations arise.

The South Louisville Antique Toy Mall has the 0-6-0 club setup and running on Sundays. There may be some space available for an N scale layout if we are interested.


