

Directions to Jerry Harris' House

Get off the Brooks Exit on Interstate 65 and head West (Turn right if coming South on 65, Turn left heading North on 65).

The hours were not known at meeting time, but will probably be on the order of 10 AM to 3 PM. This could give KSONS a chance to tune up everything in time for a January show when the Great Train Expo is expected back. A motion was made and passed approving KSONS participation in this open house with K&I.

Nominations for the Charley Hunt award can be made through the KSONS website. There have been two nominations made so far. If you know someone in our club who has made an important contribution to the hobby, then please put their name in the hat.

Our next show will be at the New Albany Floyd County library in late September. Our show coordinators are Craig Sawdo and Mike Wingfield.

Work sessions are needed on some of our modules before our next show. Kevin suggests that a scenery clinic would fit in very nicely with this and make it more fun to do the needed repairs or just to make things look better. Since there are club modules and privately owned modules at Buckner, club members were cautioned not to work on a module without the owner's permission and not to use club money to improve or repair a privately owned module. Upcoming meetings have been scheduled for the next two months. Jerry Harris will be hosting the club at his home in September. The Hardestys will host the October meeting at John Knox Church near their home. We have no November host or site yet. The December meeting will be our annual Christmas party.

Dawn has started making inquiries on a location for the Christmas party. Since Buckhead's on the river was mentioned as a site, she looked into the cost of a private room there. More inquiries will be made and she will report at the next meeting.

The member roundtable followed. Among these topics were Mark Hedge's recommendation of Yahoo groups N Scale Yard Sale as a good alternative to eBay for our purposes. The Hardestys reported on their recent trip to Toronto. The new site for the model railroad display at Sellersburg Celebrates was mentioned. This year it will be at the Moose Lodge on the south side of town. There will be three layouts on the 28th and will add a swap meet on the 29th.
