## I'm Not Cheap, I'm Frugal

If you use Digitrax as your DCC system, there is an alternative to using a Digitrax throttle. With a DT500D going for \$254 and a DT4D going for \$135, you could, instead, purchase an LNWI for \$79. The LNWI is a Wi-Fi interface that you can control trains using a smart phone. Using Engine Driver from Google Play Store, you can run up to four engines and use four smart phones per one LNWI. Whether your layout is small or requires many operators, there can be big savings. You can have an operating session with an RSVP of BYOCP (bring your own cell phone).

#### **RIP Track**

Correction Track Side: DLCX is a reporting mark for Waste Management but not a train reporting mark. DLCX is for Diesel Locomotive Company, (now that makes more sense). They provide quality locomotives that do the job from 900 -1500 HP EMD switchers to GP9-SD18 units, as well as larger 40-2 and Dash 3 locomotives. I had both engines as SDs but they are both GPs. I also misspelled John Kiess. I had it as John Keiss.

#### **Tool Time**

#### Micro Brushes, Pipe Cleaners and Cotton Swabs

Larry Stephens gave us a refresher of some of the uses of toothpicks, swabs, pipe cleaners and micro brushes.

Toothpicks have been used for years as a way to place a drop of glue or oil. Larry also used one end roughed up with sandpaper to work a drop of rust paint in the springs of trucks. When clipped to a third hand device it can reach into hard to reach places to hold items in place for soldering and gluing.

Cotton swabs are used to remove lettering, to clean small parts for painting and works quite well for cleaning wheels. The swabs from Dollar Tree are better than Q-Tips because they are harder and don't unravel so quickly. For locomotives there is a better way.

Larry has found that pipe cleaners are very good for cleaning locomotive wheels as it can clean the space between the wheel and flange. When the end is bent as a hook, it makes a quick brush to weather wheels.

Micro brushes find uses in weathering fine lines, applying precision amounts of glue, clean truck journals, applying solder flux and weathering track rails. Have some on hand. I'm sure you'll find more uses.



Denver and Salt Lake City from 1971 to 1983.

Dick Hunter displayed two photos. A photo of an engine going through the end of the Minturn, Colorado, round house with a kit built

model showing almost the same scene. A (whoops) photo of what appears to be a wooden gondola with the trucks torn from underneath.







Bob Hochstetter displayed a photo of the Colorado Eagle northbound near Colorado Springs. The train departed St. Louis, Missouri, at 4pm as Missouri Pacific train #11. It



arrived at Pueblo at 7:20am the next day. Now, with a Rio Grande crew, it is D&RGW train #3 and is scheduled to arrive in Denver at 9:50am. Photo by Otto Roach.
