#### **Tool Time**

## Jigs - Bob Rothgery

Bob started off explaining that he needed to match the paint to previously painted ore cars before he would undertake making another ten ore cars. The original paint is no longer available so he bought a sample jar of paint from Home Depot. He thinned the paint with denatured alcohol before spraying. The color turned out to be a good match.

Bob had ten of these cars to assemble. Doing these many kits, the time to make a jig to hold the parts in alignment, payed off. Bob glued styrene on a piece of plastic to hold the various pieces of the ore car in place.

Another one of his jigs was designed to make trestles. It worked regardless of the length of trestles he needed.

When Bob needs to make a fence, he'll make a jig so each section of fence is the same.

## **Non Railroad Hobby**

Gary Myers presented the hobby he had before trains. A hobby he is now getting back into. He was into plastic models and favored military vehicles. His model presented is an LST. His dad was on an LST at the end of WW2. Another model also displayed is the US Texas in 350th scale. He also bought a 200th scale model of the US Yorktown that is 48 inches long.



Dennis Hagan's second hobby is wild west history, Indian wars and 19<sup>th</sup> century military history. His research lends itself to the writing of term papers—call that a hobby? He brought in a selection of some of the magazines in which he has been published.



Bill Johnson presented a visitor guide history. Bill has always been interested in history. He was recently in Kansas City for the WW1 war memorial. At the age of four, he was with his grandparents and shook hands with a Civil War veteran, (photo came out blurry.)

Steve Schweighofer brought in a postcard mailed in 1923 from Austria which showed the proper way the stamps were to be used. This mail was carried on a glider flight; (forgot to take photo?)

Bob Rothgery brought in his fly tying arsenal. Bob is an officer in Trout Unlimited which mostly uses flies. Bob, when he goes out fishing, carries about 9 to 11 boxes, each averaging about 700 flies. Whatever the fish are biting, Bob has it covered. Bob uses feathers from roosters and fuzz from carpets. Peacock and Ostridge feathers are also used. Bob also gathers road kill for the hides which he uses for fly tying.



Larry brought in a radio from the 1940s. He started collecting and repairing radios about 1955.

This radio was restored to replace one that would no longer receive a radio station due to interference from another new station. His grandmother would listen to her daughter sing in the church choir. on that station This radio has an additional RF section giving it more amplification and selectivity.

Unfortunately, time has taken a toll on the plastic dial. It has warped badly. Using Visio, he was able to replicate the look. Laminating the Visio copy should bring the original look back.





## **Building Resin Kits - Denny Krausman**

Denny Krausman gave a presentation of building resin car kits. Resin kits are often the only way to duplicate a prototype fairly accurately. Most of the resin kits represent the 1940s and 50s. With these kits, it is important to read all the instructions before starting. These cars go together with ACC and come with extra parts as you can make different versions of the same basic car.

There are a few must have tools that are needed, such as corner clamps, 220 and 320 grit sandpaper, files, etc. Denny uses the sandpaper to remove flash using a circular motion. Using the backside of an Exacto knife, he scrapes the remaining flash. With a toothbrush and a little soap, Denny cleans the resin of remaining flash and molding oils.

Squaring up is one of the most important techniques. Make sure the pieces are square, side and ends are the same length. Details, such as roof walks and ladders, need some sanding to reduce thickness for a more realistic look. Denny then discussed the nuances of coupler pockets, applying end bars and brake system. Whenever he comes across warped parts, he uses the oven.

Denny went through tips and techniques on using ACC while doing these resin kits. Denny passed on a product called Unglue that can be used to remove ACC when we make mistakes. Another mistake that can be made is removing too much resin. Using a .010 piece of styrene and a drop of ACC this mistake can be filled in. The resin is easily drilled. The final step is to lightly file the corner sides to ensure perfect corners.

Tuesday, July 24

Ride Amtrak over Raton Pass. Board the bus at the convention center to Trinidad 7:15 AM, ride Amtrak #3 to Las Vegas, tour Las Vegas (roundhouse, Harvey House, etc.) have lunch & return to Pueblo by bus. \*

Wednesday, July 24

The Transportation Technology Center is located 25 miles northeast of Pueblo, CO and is a center for advanced railroad research and testing providing unique facilities for worldwide clientele. The center provides research, testing, and training for technology and safety-related issues for railroads around the world.

The center is owned by the U.S. Department of Transportation and is operated by Transportation Technology Center, Inc., a subsidiary of the Association of American Railroads. A bus ride (approximately 40 minutes) will take the tour participants to the center.

The tour will be a bus tour of the facility.

Vestas Tower facility located eight miles South of Pueblo is the largest tower factory in the world. The Steel Mill Museum has an in depth review of the steel mill history and operations.

If Amtrak arrives past time required for the activities in Las Vegas, busses may take us directly to Las Vegas.
