It squeezes the air and excess Micro Set from under the decal and wicks up the excess that's on top. I provided bags of five for anyone who wanted them.

This month's Show 'n' Tell segment featured Industrial Structures. Rich Flammini and Gary Myers presented items.


The Bell Pole Company is located about a mile east of where we lived in New Brighton, Minnesota. Their primary business is creosoting utility poles.

Back in the days when we weren't as concerned about toxic fumes, if the wind was blowing from the east, we knew the business was operating.

The large building is a Walthers kit that has been slightly modified with the tall building added. I've imagined what the ovens would look like and have added them.

The operation was served by an infrequently used Soo RR branch line.

My Show 'n' Tell is a little stretch for "Industry", since the Salida Steam Plant was a public utility. Originally it housed 3 boilers to power a vertical electrical generator, then later 2 large boilers. The power it generated was originally for street lighting. Narrow gauge gondola cars were delivered to a siding to provide coal for the boilers. The building has been "restored" and is still used today for community events. This model didn't work out, as many seams are just not blended. It will be replaced with a model with a full interior. The current model is being cleaned up for now as the stand in.

Handling Electricity

- DO NOT ASSUME THE CIRCUIT IS OFF!!!
- ENSURE THE CIRCUIT IS OFF!
- USE INSULATED TOOLS
- USE ONE HAND TO HOLD PROBES
- USE ALLIGATOR CLIPS

What About Model RR Voltages?

- DCC Voltage is around 1416 Volts (V)
- DCC Current is around 12 Amperes (A)
- 14V x 1A or 2A = ~ 14-28W
- · A Motor Overheating may cause a problem


A Short Between Rails of Track

- This should turn the DCC Command Station or Booster off to protect the equipment
- Never a good thing may "fry" your stuff
- DCC Circuit Breaker protectors
 - Electronic
 - Light Bulb

Ohm's Law

- A law in electricity that states that the current in a circuit is equal to the potential difference divided by the resistance of the circuit.
- In the first version of Ohm's law, I = V/R, the electrical current in a circuit can be calculated by dividing the voltage by the resistance.
- In other words, the current is directly proportional to the voltage and inversely proportional to the resistance.

Ohm's Law



American Wire Gauge (AWG)



Heed The Electrical Rating

- What is the branch circuit limit in current (15 or 20 Amps) ?
- A duplex outlet is for 2 receptacles
- A typical 15-amp, 120v branch circuit can supply up to 10 receptacle outlets (15 / 1.5 = 10)

Don't Overload The Circuit

- Using Too Many Extension Cords
- Having Too Many Loads
- · Calculate the Load Wattages
- Do NOT Overload!!!



Receptacle Orientation

 There is no official right or wrong way to orient a receptacle—the National Electrical Code doesn't specify—but you can decide by using logic and common sense.

Receptacle Orientation




6 Outlet Power Strip w/3 Foot Cord

- Used in multiple environments
- · Buy one with Built-In Circuit Breaker
- · A metal structure is much safer

Can you plug 2 extension cords into one outlet?

- Don't plug the cords together !!!!!
- Some people string two extension cords together to get a lengthier one, but this is not a good idea. Extending the cords this way can lead to overheating and overloading, creating a risk for fire. Instead, get one extension cord with the right length.

NMRA Standards and Recommended Practices

- "What Is a Standard and How Does It Differ from a Recommended Practice?"
- A Standard is a figure, relationship or dimension that is mandatory, it is cut in stone" so to speak and <a href="mailto:must be followed to facilitate interchange or interface, whichever the case may be. Standards can be changed but ONLY after the change has been reviewed by the membership, comments from the membership reviewed and where appropriate incorporated and then presented to the Board of Directors for approval.
- RPs (Recommended Practices) are those figures, relationships or dimensions that the Engineering Committee has <u>established through actual tests and feel are beneficial to operation</u>. These are presented to the Board of Directors (BOD) for their approval.




