Rock Mountain Line Layout Tour

On Thursday, April 9, a number of Division members met at Don Meeker's house in Castle Rock for a tour of his Rocky Mountain Line. The Rocky Mountain Line models a route that crosses the Rocky Mountains to the west departing from Centennial (Denver?) and crossing into Utah. The town names along the route are fictional, but one can easily imagine Colorado towns. Trains from the ATSF, MP, RI, C&S and CB&Q use this joint line. The timeframe is in the '50s, so both steam and diesel are well represented. Because of the magnificent scenery, a lot of passenger operation is also in evidence, including the Colorado Zephyr. The layout occupies approximately 2800 square feet in Don's basement. Don uses Digitrax digital command control to operate and a CTC system using Digitrax hardware and JMRI/CATS software to operate the dispatcher's computer.


The California Zephyr is making a stop at Centennial Union Station. This bears a remarkable resemblance to Denver Union Station.
