Mitchell Park Domes Show

Every year the Domes sets up a huge G Gauge layout in the flower dome, and every year there is a different theme, this year it was the pioneer era of railroading. Many of the structures were phenomenal. The layout is setup shortly after Christmas and lasts until a little before Easter.

In early February, for one weekend only, there is also an All-Scale Train Show. Z-scale, N-scale, HO-scale, S-Gauge, G Scale, Lego and Lionel have layouts displayed. In addition, the Milwaukee Light Engineering Society, a live steam club, has a display with an engine on 7.5" track. The All-Scale Train Show included train exhibitors throughout "both" the lobby, and Greenhouse #7. There were a total 13 layouts on display plus some displays. BSG was represented by Ron's "Hollywood meets Model Railroading", American Flyer layout.


The show is advertised as a Saturday and Sunday event with Friday being the setup day. Sometimes it is a bit of a task setting up. 620 people came through the doors on Friday. Although you are in the middle of setting up, there is still a lot of interaction with the public. The domes furnish a catered supper for the participating clubs.

Saturday there were 3,250 in attendance and on Sunday 2,500 attended. We had a limited amount of S gauge material available but did have BSG info sheets there. Let's hope that out of nearly 6,400 people we might pick up a new member.

In saying the above, Paul Bartelak and I set up, tore down and packed the layout in the van. I will be working on trying to cut the setup time to less than 6 to 7 hours and breakdown to less than 4-1/2 hours. One of the problems is that every other club layout had more than two individuals helping out with their layouts.

Fall S Fest 2025

The major planning stages are getting into full swing. The order and down payment has been made by BSG. We are hoping to get photos of the cars prior to our May/June registration mailing. It was decided to have two paint schemes and two different car numbers 4850 and 4851. The sides will be the same. The 4850 will have a black roof and ends and the 4851 will have silver roof and ends. There may be a "very" limited amount of special cars made.



In the near future the price will be established for the Fall S Fest cars. There is a considerable cost to hosting a Fall S Fest Convention. We are planning to take prepaid orders for BSG members, to provide for preliminary FSF expenses. There will be a discount for "Club" members.

With the passing of some of BSG's members over the recent years, we will be pressed with having a manpower issue. This year will be BSG's 50th anniversary.
