The Gandy Dancers (HO) Model Railroad Club (at their past location) occasionally held small model railroad shows. They invited various clubs to participate, it was an all-gauge affair. BSG setup a small version of the old tabletop layout. In a brief conversation with one of their members, Ray Puls mentioned that BSG loved their clubhouse, and how we always had the desire to have a place of our own.

At that time, they had plenty of room, after those small expos had concluded. After a discussion with their club officers, we were graciously invited to have a space allotted to us for our modular layout. Here we are.

After the January open house sessions, the Gandy Dancers scheduled another open house again on March 1st, from 10:am-6:00pm. The turnout was not as large as the previous ones, but there was a fair number of individuals that stopped in. Some of them, did spend time at our layout. During the day, (at one time or another), the Gandy Dancers had up to ten members running trains and interacting with the public. Our club, somewhat due to other commitments, and illness, had 4 members present, for only a portion of time. However, the "majority" of the time, only one was there alone. Bummer. There is another open house scheduled for May 3rd.

Both BSG and the Gandy Dancers will have to work on, better advertising the existence of our model railroad clubs. Besides HO and S Gauge, there is G Gauge and N Gauge layouts, plus displays.

It is imperative that both clubs increase their number of members. We know that there are S gaugers in our general area, we have to reach out to them and possibly interest them in joining the Badgerland S Gaugers. I believe that we have more to offer than ever before.

BSG Layout Progress

Ray Puls has been replacing all of the aluminum plug-in module legs on the inside modules. After years of use and abuse, the old legs were very unstable. After that, Ray will be laser leveling the modules. The scenery improvements can then get started. In addition, the planning and construction of the two new inner loops will begin. Proposals have been looked into for the internal geezer gate and the revising of all of the backdrops.

The construction on the passing siding has started. After the leveling, that project can be completed. Some of the scenery was removed to clear the modules for better viewing. Different ideas for these are being discussed. Hopefully, over the Summer, by Fall, there will be a great improvement.

I'm still looking for more "G" scale stuff for the window display. We will try to make it look a little like a layout, rather than *a train on a rug*.

Mad-City Train Show

Well, how was the Madison show this year? The attendance was down because of the snow. The Saturday attendance was about 2,400 which was about half of the normal attendance. Sunday attendance was about 2,600, this is about normal for Sundays. There were 33 layouts, 18 exhibitors, and 61 vendors at 290 tables. About 6 of the vendors were new to the show. All 6 said they would be back for the 2026 show. There is always a lot of American Flyer available at Madison than other model railroad event in Wisconsin.

It's always a great experience to attend the Madison show. One reason is the hall arrangement with wide aisles and a friendly atmosphere. BSG has always been treated very well at this event. Our layout is always located right near the front door, this gives us great exposure. However, we will have to get even more "S Gauge" informational material on the provided table.

A ton of thanks to Paul Bartelak, Bob Blomberg assisting me with the setup. Once again Fred Vergenz brought some awesome locomotives to run. With myself, Paul, Fred and Phil Piscitello (who was there all-day Sunday) we broke down and loaded the layout in two hours flat, which was a record time.



Delavan Train Show

The Delavan show is officially the last show that BSG will attend until 2026. No Trainfest 2025 this year again, it was decided to remain in downtown Milwaukee. The main reason is that no one in the club wanted to assist with the layout. But worst of all, they moved it up to the first weekend. This coincides with our 2025 Fall S Fest. Hopefully some year it may move back to the State Fair Park in West Allis WI. Until then, we will lose our exposure at the largest model railroad show in Wisconsin.

All that being said, how was Delavan? In the past, at one time, Delavan was a bigger show, drawing over 6,000 for the two-day event. Then Covid hit, it was cancelled for a while and the administration changed. The new committee is working hard to rebuild the show. This year the show had five additional venues outside of the American Legion post, one of which had a swap meet. There were some really great deals even on American

Flyer items. There were raffles and prizes. The kitchen had some really tasty food items, which were reasonably priced.

The Badgerland S Gauge, represented layout, was once again (as always) given the premier location in the main hall. A lot of the BSG and S Gauge material was picked up on our display table. This year the two-day attendance was around 2,000. With the committees plans for the future, more venues will be added for next years event. For BSG this show is always enjoyable.

Again, thanks to Paul Bartelak for assisting me with the setup. Dependable Fred Vergenz brought locomotives and passengers cars to run. With myself, Paul, Fred and Phil Piscitello we broke down the layout in less than two hours flat. I wish I had gotten his name but a young man (high school age) offered his assistance and it did make a difference, After the loading of the van, he said quote, "I still don't believe that everything fit in that mini-van".

Including the Mitchell Park Domes, Mad-City and the Delevan shows, BSG was present and had exposure to well over 13,000 individuals. Sooner or later, we have to figure out why we don't increase our membership.
