Old Business:

Ron Schlicht suggested that the club purchase a step stool for work on the layout. With the addition of some of past members modules, the depth went from the 30 inches to 60 inches deep. This will provide the two additional loops of track.

Tom Patterson discussed ordering more of the sold-out Fall S Fest Milwaukee Road boxcars from American Models. The minimum re-order would be 50 cars. Tom also volunteered to take complete control of all phases of this project.

One downside during the Fall S Fest was the interest in the raffle tickets. The total number of items were six or seven. The income was minimal.

Ron Schlicht reported that the auction of some special Milwaukee Road boxcars went very well at the Machine Shed banquet on Saturday night.

Roy Meissner reported that our membership total is around 30 members.

Ron Schlict noted that there still are a lot of estate items remaining to be sold.

<u>John Mann, Joel Lebovitz, George Sorenson</u> and others pitched in offering advice based on their experiences with past Fal S Fests.

<u>Bob Ristow</u>, a non-member, was present every hour of the event helping out at registration and other duties.

Last but not least, the Badgerland S Gaugers Fall S Fest Committee, all 8 of them. In addition, a small number of the other BSG club members who helped out with the hall arrangements and other tasks when needed, to make FSF 2025 possible.
