

Trip from West into Tabletop.

Trains from the West on the Tablelands and heading East, arrive into the River Port town of Tabletop. Such trains can be either goods, passenger or mixed traffic.

In addition to the railway goods traffic from the West, River boats ply the navigable Barron River on the Tablelands and bring goods to the Wharf at Tabletop from localities North of town. Those goods are transshipped at Tabletop and are destined for Export loading onto Ships at Shenanigan's Wharf down the Range on the Coast.

The train rounds a curved trestle to cross Goanna Creek then we arrive at Tabletop from the Western end.

At Tabletop, trains can be operated in several ways;

- The Eastern Line runs downgrade via a scenic decent to the Coastal Terminus at Shenanigan's Wharf. Both passenger and goods trains operate in both directions on this line. During off-peak hours, or tourist 'low-season', the Railmotor is used for passenger services. At Shenanigan's Station there is a connection via a loop line that enables trains to run East then turn South to traverse the South Coast Line to the beachside at Sundial Station, then via Orange Junction, return back to Shenanigan's in a continuous run.
- The Western Line is for both Goods trains and Passenger traffic. Lighter locomotives can be used on the near-level Tablelands to the West. While Tabletop township is a popular destination with tourists, Excursion and Tourist trains never venture further West.
- At the end of a days train running, our train can return to the Basement.
